Pamukkale

Pamukkale, meaning "cotton castle" in Turkish, is a natural site in Denizli Province in southwestern Turkey. The Denizli province is located in the Aegean region of Turkey.



The area is famous for a carbonate mineral left by the flowing of thermal spring water. It is located in the River Menderes valley, which has a temperate climate for most of the year.



Pamukkale's water is good for all kinds of rheumatic diseases, high blood pressure, cardiovascular diseases, calcification, cellulite, wrinkles, skin softening, acne treatment due to its antiseptic properties.



Cappadocia

Cappadocia, a semi-arid region in central Turkey, is known for its distinctive “fairy chimneys,” tall, cone-shaped rock formations clustered in Monks Valley, Göreme and elsewhere.



Other notable sites include Bronze Age homes carved into valley walls by troglodytes (cave dwellers) and later used as refuges by early Christians. The 100m-deep Ihlara Canyon houses numerous rock-face churches.



Kaymakli Underground City (Turkish: Kaymaklı; Cappadocian Greek: Αἰακού) is contained within the citadel of Kaymakli in the Central Anatolia Region of Turkey. First opened to tourists in 1964, the village is about 19 km from Nevşehir, on the Nevşehir-Niğde road.



Erciyes

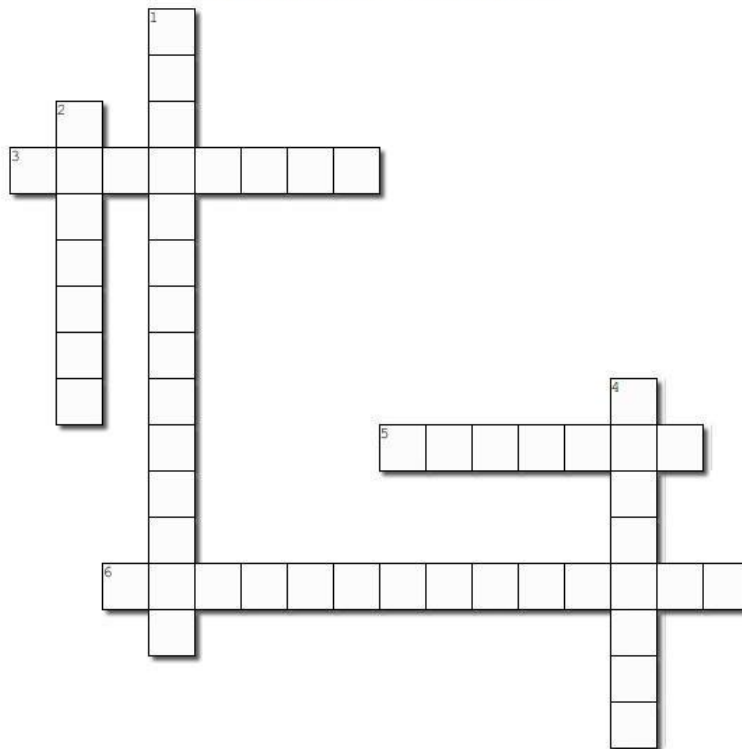
Mount Erciyes is the fifth largest mountain in Turkey. It is a non-active volcanic mountain. It's last eruption was in 6880 BCE \pm 40 years.



The ski centre at Mt Erciyes is located on the north to east side of the mountain with the same name. It is a 3,917 m (12,851 ft) high volcanic peak and provides impressive views from all around.
